

Loch Luna Game Reserve



Location: 180 km NE of Adelaide,
via Sturt Highway, off Barmera-
Morgan Rd, near Nappers Bridge.

Size: 2 059 hectares

Loch Luna Game Reserve comprises a range of water bodies including narrow creeks and shallow swamps. The area contains a variety of environments that provide important habitat for many aquatic birds and mammals. Loch Luna is ideal for canoeing and birdwatching.

Opposite the township of Cobdogla, over the Kingston Bridge, lies a small section of Loch Luna known as the Kaiser Strip. Situated either side of the Sturt Highway causeway, this section is a great place for day visits, camping, fishing and canoeing.

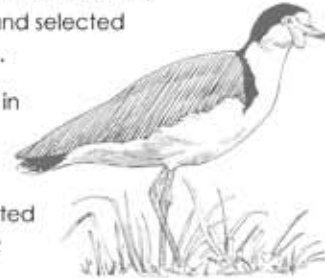
Cobdogla and Kingston on Murray boat ramps are available for launching boats.

THINGS TO DO

- **Canoeing** ~ Nockburra and Chambers Creeks.
- **Fishing** ~ Very popular and rewarding.
- **Camping** ~ Along the River and Chambers Creek.
- **Bird watching** ~ Waterbirds and dryland species.
- **Scenic** ~ Popular day visit area.
- **Waterfowl Hunting** ~ On open days only.

REMINDERS

- Campers are required to use designated campsites.
- Camping permits are required when camping in the reserve. Permits are available from self-registration stations, the Berri District Office and selected Riverland tourist centres.
- Dogs are not permitted in the reserve.
- During fire ban season only gas fires are permitted and fire restrictions must be observed.
- Please use fireplaces where provided.
- Waterfowl hunting is permitted in restricted areas on open days only. For information on open season days, permits and restrictions contact the Department for Environment and Heritage.
- Please keep to established access tracks.
- Be aware of dangerous snags in the creek.
- Avoid visiting the reserve during wet weather and flooding, you may get bogged.

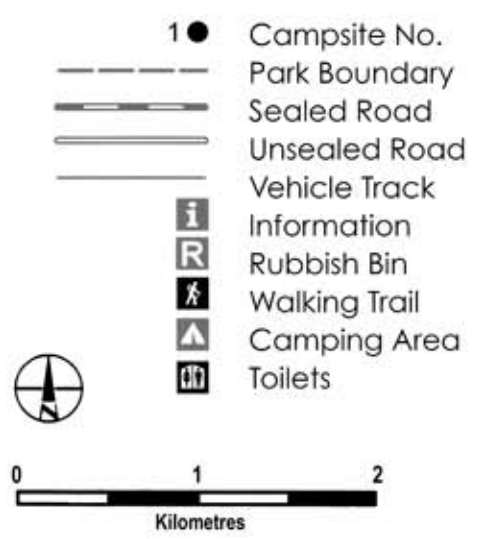
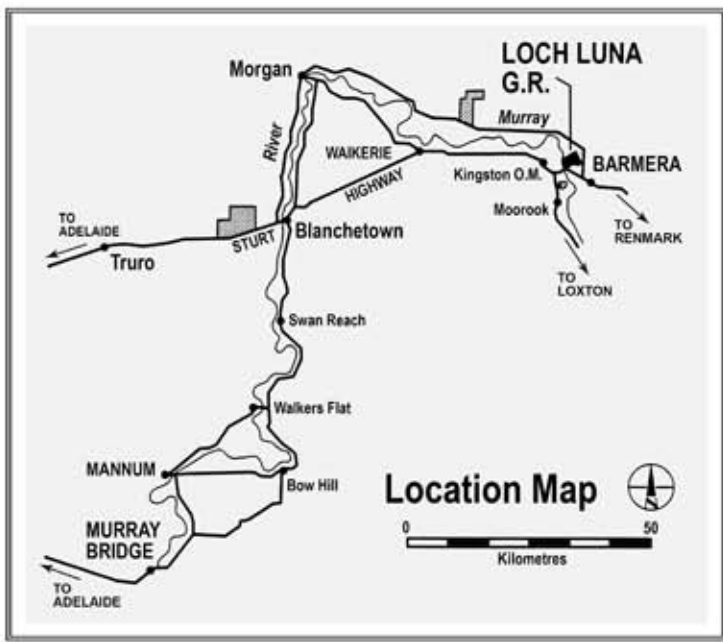
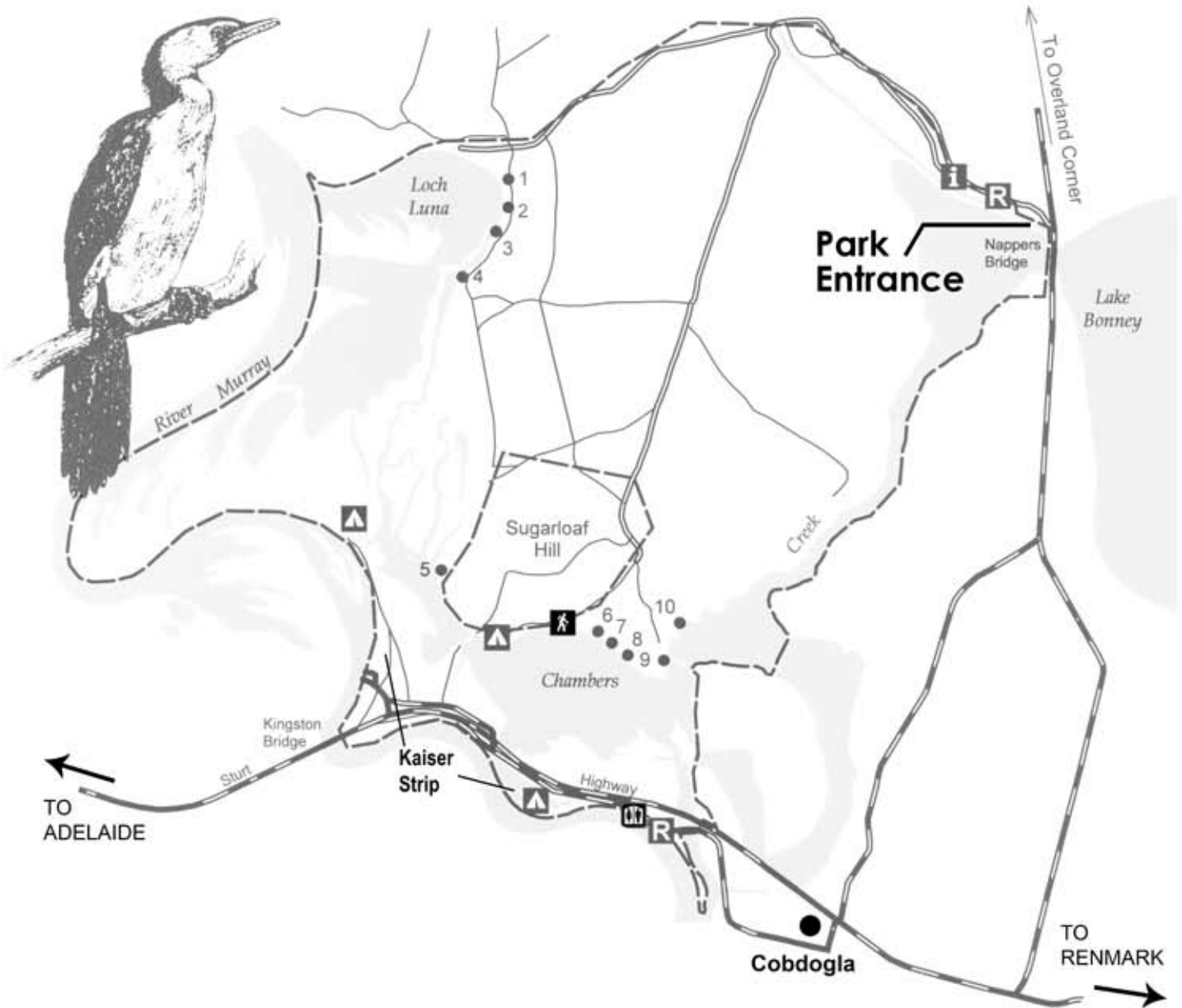
