LIST OF SUGGESTED TOPICS 2007/2008

Architects

Studies of individual architects and their works.

Architectural Styles

Studies thereof, including any South Australian or regional variants.

Builders and craftsmen

Studies of individual builders and craftsmen and their work and techniques.

Building Materials

Studies of specific materials, the extent of their use and the extant buildings made from them. Studies of the conservation of building materials.

Industries

Documentation of major and minor industries and their extant buildings eg. Flour milling, brewing, agricultural implement making, manufacturing, eucalyptus distilleries, tanneries, wattle bark, olive growing and pressing, ...

Interiors

Locating and documenting historic and relatively intact building interiors.

Literature Surveys

Preparing finding aids and guide sheets to assist researchers locate good primary and secondary sources. Typically these would comprise annotated bibliographies. They could extend to trade literature. (The Architecture Museum library holds an extensive range of product catalogues and pamphlets.)

Typological studies

Analyses of various types of buildings and structures eg. post and telegraph offices, schools, churches, banks, railway stations, police stations, court houses, institutes, hotels, friendly society halls, shearing sheds...

Vernacular architecture

Studies of traditions transported from settlers' homelands, including English, Scottish, Cornish and German vernaculars.
