

**SOUTH AUSTRALIAN HERITAGE ACT  
1978**

**DESIGNATION OF STATE  
HERITAGE AREA**

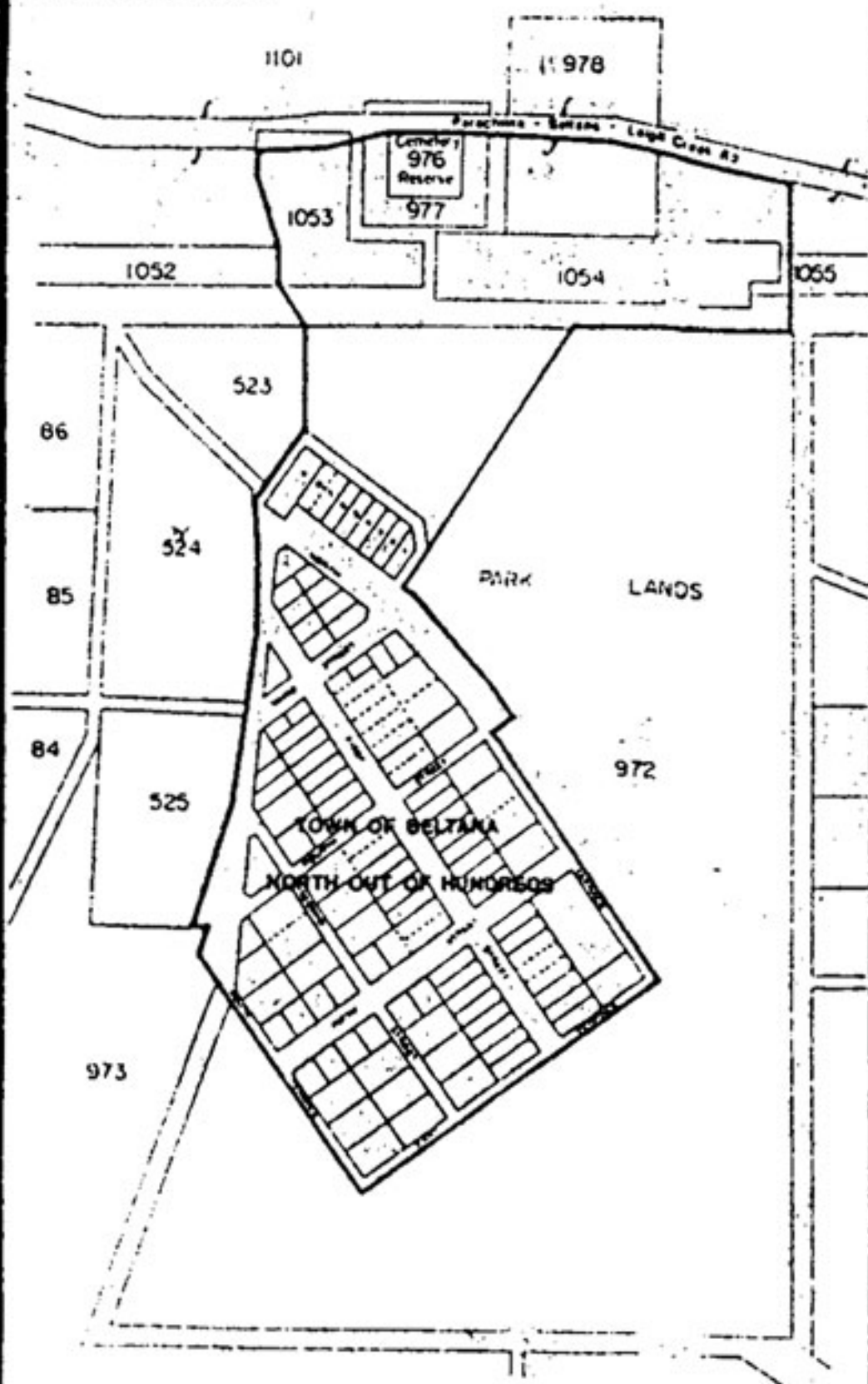
Where the Minister considers that an area of land is part of the physical, social or cultural heritage of the State and that it has significant aesthetic, historical or cultural interest, then the Minister may designate that area of land as a State Heritage Area.

Pursuant to the provisions of Section 13 of the South Australian Heritage Act, 1978, I, Donald Jack Hopgood, Minister for Environment and Planning and Minister for the time being administering the said Act, hereby designate the area defined and shown in The Schedule as a State Heritage Area.

**THE SCHEDULE**

**All that land bounded as follows:**

Commencing at a point on the north-eastern corner of section 972, north out of hundred, thence proceeding westerly along the northern boundary of the said section for 335 metres; thence south-westerly for 410 metres; thence south-westerly along the north-eastern boundary of a road abutting section 1; thence south-easterly along the north-eastern boundary of North Terrace; thence south-westerly and south-easterly along the northern boundary of North Terrace for 462.69 metres; thence south-westerly along the south-western boundary of East Terrace for 583.39 metres; thence north-westerly along the north-western boundary of South Terrace; thence along the north-eastern boundary of section 973 to the south-eastern corner of section 525; thence northerly along the eastern boundary of sections 525, 524 and 523 to the north-eastern corner of section 523; thence north-westerly to the south-eastern corner of section 1052; thence northerly along the eastern boundary of section 1052 to the north-eastern corner of section 1052; thence north-westerly along the western boundary of section 1053 to a point meeting the southern boundary of Parachilna-Beltana-Leigh Creek Road; thence easterly along the southern boundary of the said road for 850 metres; thence southerly to the point of commencement.
