SHR 13858 – confirmed as a State Heritage Place 29 June 1989*

This two-storey, limestone building is a significant feature in the Goolwa State Heritage Area and aligns with the neighbouring Corio Hotel.

The Australasian Hotel was built in 1857, with the first licence granted on 13 January 1858 to O.W. Willcock. Eleven licensees operated the hotel until its closure in March 1934. During its years as a hotel it was also occasionally gazetted as the 'Australian Arms'.
