## Shop

2 Cadell Street, Goolwa

SHR 10358 – confirmed as a State Heritage Place 24 July 1980

This attractive two-storey building, which combines residence and shop, is an integral part of Goolwa's streetscape and of the heritage of the area.

It was constructed c1850s for Mr Sumner, a baker, and is linked to the river trade and the early settlement of Goolwa. Sumner's bakery provided a welcome service for the town's residents, river men and industry workers.

The building's unusual design is its most significant feature – the front facade has a bow-shaped appearance (both wall and windows) as it follows the curved allotment boundary. Other construction details include limestone walls with brick quoins and window surrounds, a corrugated iron roof, and a cantilevered balcony with turned wooden posts.
