

Notice of Intention to Alter the South Australian Heritage Register by Altering an Entry

On exceptionally rare occasions the South Australian Heritage Council (Council) makes the decision to remove a State Heritage Place from the South Australian Heritage Register (Register) or to Alter an entry of a State Heritage Place by excluding part of the place to which the entry applies. Section 23 of the *Heritage Places Act 1993* (Act) enables the Council to do so 'if ... after taking into the account the criteria ... the Council is of the opinion that an entry relating to a place is no longer justified, or that an entry relating to a State Heritage Place should be altered by excluding part of the place to which the entry applies'.

As a part of the process of altering a State Heritage Place in the Register, the Council must give notice in writing of its intention and invite the public to make submissions about the proposed removal. The Council then considers all of the submissions before deciding whether or not to alter the place.

Normanville Coastal Dunes Geological Site - First Additional Area (SHP 14041)

Normanville Coastal Dunes Geological Site - First Additional Area was confirmed as a State Heritage Place in the Register on 11 May 1995 under the *Heritage Places Act 1993*. The Statement of Significance states:

These relatively untouched sandhills, with their cover of native vegetation, are the last major relics of similar coastal dunes that once existed along the east coast of Gulf St Vincent. The dunes provide information on the processes of shoreline development during the Holocene (5,000 years), forming a double crested system with younger foredunes to seaward and older dunes inland. These dunes are also an important source for the replenishment of beach sand in the area.

Why is the SA Heritage Council altering this place in the Register?

Council received advice from the District Council of Yankalilla, Heritage South Australia and the Coast and Marine Branch in DEW suggesting that allotments 115, 116 and 117 could be removed from the listing as they relate to the Normanville Caravan Park site including car park, not the State heritage-listed coastal dunes.
