

Trap and Release Protected Animals Permit

Application Information

Legislation

National Parks and Wildlife Act 1972 (section 53(1)(c) or (d) and 55)

National Parks and Wildlife (Wildlife) Regulations 2019

Overview

The Department for Environment and Water (DEW) is responsible for regulating the management of wildlife (i.e. native animals) in accordance with the *National Parks and Wildlife Act 1972* ('the Act') and all Regulations and Proclamations made under the Act. A permit is required to take (e.g. capture, trap) protected animals or release protected animals back to the wild.

Under the Act it is an offence to take a protected animal or release to the wild any native animal, whether protected or unprotected, without a permit.

Policy statement

DEW encourages a living with wildlife approach to address the impacts caused by wildlife in a way that is humane and socially acceptable.

Where protected animals:

- are causing, or likely to cause, damage to environmental amenity (including built structures); or
 - constitute a safety risk or hazard to people or industry,
- a permit may be granted to manage the impact caused.

DEW will support a living with wildlife approach that includes the granting of a permit to capture, trap and release a protected animal. The capture, trap and release of protected animals that are dangerous or a biological hazard is restricted to suitably qualified persons that hold a valid Wildlife Management (Controller) Permit.

Permit description

The Trap and Release Protected Animals Permit entitles the holder to trap and release (not as part of an ongoing activity) protected animals, identified in the permit by reference to their species, that are causing or likely to cause damage to environmental amenity (including built structures) or may constitute a safety risk or hazard to people or industry, but are not dangerous or a biological hazard.

Animal welfare

The welfare of all animals that are captured, trapped or released is important to DEW and the treatment of all animals must comply with the *Animal Welfare Act 1985* and the limitations, restrictions and conditions of the permit granted.

Fit and proper person assessment

Applicants will be asked whether they have been convicted of prior offences against the *National Parks and Wildlife Act 1972*, *Animal Welfare Act 1985*, South Australian firearms legislation or other environment legislation interstate and/or overseas. Where a conviction is declared, applicants must provide a description of the offence, along with the year and State/Territory/Country.

Applicants can still proceed with an application and have it assessed.

How long will it take to obtain a permit?

Your application can take up to 4 weeks to process, however most applications are assessed within 10 working days.

Fees

No permit fee applies.

Do I need to keep records?

Yes. The form will be provided upon the granting of a permit.
Further permits will not be granted unless the completed form is submitted.

How long does a permit last?

Typically a permit is granted for a period of up to 3 months.

Traps used to capture possums

The following minimum specifications for possum traps applies-
Minimum trap size dimensions: 540mm (L) x 240mm (W) x 240mm (H)
Maximum individual grid mesh size: 19mm x 19mm (or an equivalent area)
Trap door mechanism: spiral bait holder or pressure mounted foot treadle to activate door release

Where do I send my completed application form?

You will need to send your completed application form to the Department for Environment and Water office that is located nearest to the property being affected by wildlife.
